Genevan Catechism

The manner of questioning children who wish to receive the Supper of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Parent/Minister: In whom do you believe?

Child: In God the Father, and in Jesus Christ His Son, and in the Holy Spirit.

Parent/Minister: The Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit, are they more than one God?

Child: No.

Parent/Minister: Should we serve God according to His commandments or according

to the traditions of men?

Child: We must serve Him according to His commandments and not according to the commandments of men.

Parent/Minister: Can you obey the commandments of God on your own?

Child: No.

Parent/Minister: Then who does them in you?

Child: The Holy Spirit.

Parent/Minister: And when God gives you His Holy Spirit, can you do them perfectly?

Child: Not at all.

Parent/Minister: And yet God curses and rejects all those who do not completely keep His commandments.

Child: It is true.

Parent/Minister: How, then, can you be saved and delivered from the curse of God?

Child: By the death and suffering of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Parent/Minister: To whom do you pray?

Child: To God.

Parent/Minister: In whose name do you pray to Him?

Child: In the name of our Lord Jesus Christ who is our advocate and intercessor.

Parent/Minister: How many sacraments are in the Christian church?

Child: Two.

Parent/Minister: What are they?

Child: Baptism and the Holy Supper.

GENEVAN CATECHISM 1

Parent/Minister: What is the significance of baptism?

Child: It has two parts. Because in it our Lord shows us the forgiveness of our sins and then our regeneration and spiritual renewal.

Parent/Minister: And the Supper, what does it signify to us?

Child: It signifies to us that by the communication of the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ, our souls are nourished in the hope of eternal life.

Parent/Minister: What does the bread and the wine given to us in the Supper represent to us?

Child: They represent to us that the body and blood of Jesus Christ has the same virtue toward our souls that bread and wine have toward our bodies.

Parent/Minister: Do you think that the body of Jesus Christ is in the bread and his blood in the wine?

Child: Not at all.

Parent/Minister: Where, then, must we seek Jesus Christ so that we might have the benefit?

Child: In heaven, in the glory of God His Father.

Parent/Minister: What is the way to go up to heaven, there where Jesus is?

Child: By faith.

Parent/Minister: It is necessary, therefore, to have true faith before we can rightly take this holy sacrament.

Child: Yes.

Parent/Minister: And how can we have this faith?

Child: We have it by the Holy Spirit, who lives in our hearts and renders certain to us the promises of God that are made to us in the Gospel.
